### **V.** Discussion

- a. Continued 2021-2022 Homeschool Program Discussion (Mrs. McClelland)
  Continuation of the Homeschool Program discussion from the 04/14/2021 meeting
- We are looking to move forward with a Homeschool High School program
- Our minimum number would not be 25 students if we need to add another class, we would need to add an additional teacher, which would mean an increase in minimum enrollment
- o The programs that are being presented by Eric Dinnel would be completely run and marketed by Eric and his team, NSCA would just receive a portion of funding
  - Some programs would need the use of a room in our building, but the class materials and other aspects come from a third-party vendor
- Brad Miller, it is no longer the case that the State issues new school codes for part time school programs
  - o This is now done at the district-level, if deemed necessary
  - We are not precluded from part time programming, but if it is a different type of program than what we applied for, we would need to notify ASD 20
  - We would possibly need permission from ASD 20 to have a third-party vendor providing learning as a part of our school model
- o Doug Downey: as a group, we were impressed with the design and fidelity of the programs as they were presented to us.
- Aaron Salt: would all four programs (Front Range Construction Program, Sports Management, Outdoor Education Program, Agriculture and Agri-Business) be something that we feel comfortable utilizing?
- o Kim McClelland: Yes.
- o Aaron Salt: are we marketing this? Is Eric marketing this?
- Kim McClelland: Eric is in charge of marketing this program. He said he needs 10-15 students in each program to make it go, but we are not responsible for marketing those seats.
- o Aaron Salt: Where is the program going to be held?

- o Kim McClelland: We have the two Homeschool classrooms and we have the option to utilize a third classroom if we offer programs on different days.
  - As we look at our long-term plan, we would have to look at the layout because our 5-year build-out plan utilizes those rooms for middle school classes
  - Aaron Salt: When we discussed this before, we were uncomfortable with high school students being in the same building and sharing a bathroom with elementary students. Is that still the case?
    - Kim McClelland: I am not comfortable with those students being in the building at the same time. We would have to get creative with the interaction of students to see what is available for us as options. Some of the programs would not meet onsite all the time, so it could be mitigated in that way.
  - Aaron Salt: I would like to see some kind of criteria in order for students to be accepted into the program so that we do not have students with delinquencies that are allowed in without any conditions.

### b. 2021-2022 Proposed Budget Discussion (Mrs. Hilborn, Mrs. McClelland)

- o Maureen Hilborn: We are actively interviewing candidates for the open positions.
  - Our PPP Loan Forgiveness is completed and the bank approved the full loan forgiveness
  - o There are no major changes to the budget at this time
- Kim McClelland: We are looking into options for covering the cost of increased benefits to our staff members
- Maureen Hilborn: ASD 20 is covering the increased cost for their employees, so we are looking at that option for our employees as well
  - o There is no set dollar amount at this time, it will depend on the information we get from Cigna with our total amount
- Kim McClelland: I had a call with Becky Allen today and we will be receiving approximately \$198,000.00 that we can spend through 2024
  - 20% needs to go towards covering learning loss
  - I am hesitant to hire staff with these funds because it is a one-time amount and an employee is an annual cost
  - We are looking at possibly getting some updated tech for teachers
  - The HVAC updates will be reflected into our refinance
